Achieving growth in these areas would ultimately impact students in the following ways:

- Students will take ownership of their learning and feel empowered to take risks and embrace challenges to help them succeed.
- Students will see themselves as leaders and will gain confidence in their ability to lead themselves and others.

DO: Lead Measures/Strategies

- 1. Livingstone school staff will engage in professional development to assist them in implementing the 7 Habits as a character education program. The 7 Habits will be used as common language throughout the school.
- 2. Creation of staff action teams to increase distributed leadership within the school, and to ensure Livingstone School priorities remain the focus throughout the year.
- 3. Increase community engagement through parent surveys and increased communication about the happenings at Livingstone school.
- 4. Staff will facilitate and/or share professional learnings at staff meetings, ISC and PD days.
- 5. School administration will continue to provide opportunities for student voice and will offer more opportunities for students to be leaders in the school community. This will include opportunities to lead sessions on Flex Fridays, Sabre Days and leading school assemblies/events.
- 6. School administration will build community partnerships to provide more opportunities for student leadership in the community.
- 7. Family School Liaison, will teach socio-emotional learning to increase students self-awareness and self-advocacy for success.
- 8. Direct instruction of leadership skills to all students.

- Students will believe and feel they are cared about and safe to be themselves around staff and students in the school.
- Students will see themselves as change agents in creating a welcoming environment for their peers.

DO: Lead Measures/Strategies

- Creation of a staff action team focused on Livingstone School's connected community WIG.
- 2. Continue to develop and extend place-based, integrative learning opportunities by extending partnerships to our local community, dual-credit opportunities and LRSD place-based learning coordinators.
- 3. Continue to develop and improve our Collaborative Response practices.
- 4. Develop school-wide understanding and implementation of instructional frameworks that support an inclusive and culturally responsive learning environment.
- 5. Hold monthly assemblies related to the 7 Habits and use multi-age groupings to enhance students' sense of belonging school-wide.
- 6. Continued collaboration with community programs, including Lundbreck town council, the Lundbreck community garden, and finding additional ways to get out into the community on a regular basis.
- 7. Through leadership classes, and the continuum of learning, students will engage in service projects that have a positive impact on the school community and beyond.

- 8. Continuation of our student initiated Gay Straight Alliance for students in grades 7 through 12, to provide a safe gathering place for students who identify as part of the LGBTQ+ community.
- 9. Continuation of an inclusive athletics program, where all students have the opportunity to be a part of a team.
- 10. Continuation of Principal Advisory Committee meetings to provide students with voice regarding school improvement.
- 11. Promotion of mental health awareness and coping strategies for students, including how to manage stress and anxiety, proactive strategies to promote mental health, how to engage in healthy relationships and set healthy boundaries. These will be taught in health classes, as well as during Flex Friday sessions, and as needed for specific cohorts.

Achieving growth in these areas would ultimately impact students in the following ways:

- Students are able to apply personal leadership habits to plan, prioritize, and persevere in their academic pursuits.
- Teachers are able to support their students in learning and applying the behaviors linked to effective goal achievement.

DO: Lead Measures

- 1. Students will write diagnostic, standardized assessments in reading and mathematics to determine level of ability and inform teaching practice.
- 2. Continuation of literacy intervention for students in grades 1 to 3 to ensure they are demonstrating growth in reading and writing.
- 3. Continuation of literacy and numeracy intervention on Flex Fridays for students in grades 7 to 12 who are performing below grade level.
- 4. Implementation of goal setting time for the first 10 minutes of each day to help students set and monitor personal and academic goals.
- 5. Refinement of our Collaborative Response Protocols to ensure meetings are solution focused and data informed.
- 6. Students and staff work collaboratively to set high and appropriate academic goals and share with parents/guardians at October Goal Setting Conferences.
- 7. Continue to work closely with our career practitioner, Lettie Croskery, to promote the exploration of various career opportunities.

- 8. Continuation of common divisional assessments: Literacy: STAR Reading, LeNS, CC3, EYE-TA, Numeracy: CAT4 (Grades 2 and 5), STAR Numeracy.
- 9. Continuation of incoming Kindergarten EYE-DA and K Orientation Day.
- 10. Implementation of PAT and Diploma Preparation classes on Flex Fridays for students in grades 9 and 12.
- 11. Implementation of study skills courses offered on Flex Fridays for students in grades 7-12.
