Top Ten Tips for Reading Out Loud to Children

1. Teach your child how to hold and care for books.
2. Capture your child's interest by discussing titles & pictures before reading.
3. Let your child retell or pretend read using the pictures.
4. Talk about where to start reading. Use your finger to track the words to develop the idea of matching the spoken word to the printed word.
5. Read different types of books!
6. Family reading time after supper is a great way to encourage reading for leisure.
7. Be playful, enthusiastic and expressive as you read!
8. Read books that your child is interested in.
9. Be willing to read favorite stories over and over again.
10. Share ideas, feelings and thoughts while you read to help your child make connections between their own life and what you are reading.
