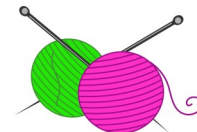

AR—Accelerated Reader Program

If your child has been telling you about AR and showing off prizes, these were their rewards for reaching their reading goals in the past goal period. The school year has been divided up into six goal periods. During each goal period, your child has been given a goal to reach and was implemented in the younger grades in January. To reach their goal, the students read a book at their level and take a short quiz. Their level is assessed through diagnostic tests which are administered by the classroom teacher. They then are directed to books in the appropriate reading level and these levels are reviewed frequently and adjusted as needed.
